# Ascension of the Lord

**ASCENSION:** the act of rising to a higher level

# The Ascension of the Lord takes place forty days after the resurrection of Jesus (Easter).

Technically, this day falls on a Thursday, but the celebration is transferred to the following Sunday.

On this day, Jesus was taken up to Heaven in his resurrected body in the presence of his apostles.

### **BIBLICAL REFERENCES**

While he was blessing them, he withdrew from them and was carried up into heaven. Luke 24:51

So then the Lord Jesus, after he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven and sat down at the right hand of God. Mark 16:19

"Today our Lord Jesus Christ ascended into heaven; let our hearts ascend with him."

As the apostles were watching, Jesus was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven." Acts 1:9-11

The ascension is also professed in the Nicene Creed and in the Apostles' Creed: "He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father..."



Jesus departs, he ascends to Heaven. He returns to the Father. But this does not mean a separation, for he remains forever with us, in a new way. By his ascension, the Risen Lord draws the gaze of the Apostles - and our gaze - to the heights of Heaven to show us that the end of our journey is the Father... Yet, Jesus remains present and active in the affairs of human history through the power and the gifts of his Spirit; he is beside each of us: even if we do not see him with our eyes, **He is there!** He accompanies us, he guides us, he takes us by the hand and he lifts us up when we fall down.... 

#### THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD - MAY 12, 2024

This weekend (May 11<sup>th</sup>/12<sup>th</sup>), the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. Throughout most of the world, this celebration fell this past Thursday to mark forty days after Easter Sunday. In our diocese (and most of the United States), however, this solemnity is moved to the nearest Sunday to allow as many of the Faithful as possible to celebrate this great event of the Paschal Mystery.

In the Ascension of the Lord, the Church realizes that her true home is heaven (Philippians 3:20-21). The Lord's departure is not to be seen as an ending, but truly as a beginning. As the Apostles gaze heavenward, they do so with hearts full of anticipation for the promised coming of the Holy Spirit (John 14:15-31). This is a pivotal moment preparing for the foundation of the Church at Pentecost.

The nine days between the Ascension and Pentecost is truly a novena as the Apostles prayerfully prepare for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. May we imitate their example and spend these days until Pentecost prayerfully opening our hearts to receive and accept the gift of the Holy Spirit into our lives today. The Holy Spirit will lead us until we too "will be taken up in the clouds to meet Christ, and be with our Lord forever!" (1 Thessalonians 4:16)

In addition to the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord, we, as a nation, also celebrate **Mother's Day** this weekend. We wish a Happy Mother's Day to our mothers, grandmothers, godmothers, and all women who have acted as mothers to us throughout our lives. In the words of St. Teresa of Calcutta: "How grateful we must be to God for this wonderful gift of motherhood that brings such joy to the whole world."

After Masses this weekend, we have a special gift of carnations to give to the women of our parish as a sign of our love and gratitude for you. Thank you for your presence in our lives and for how you live out, in your own Godgiven way, the great gift of motherhood in your lives. These carnations also serve to support women throughout our entire area, coming from a fundraiser for the Northeast Indiana Right to Life that our parish helps to support.

On May 1<sup>st</sup>, we held our last Parish Council meeting for the year before our summer break. I wish to give a special "Thank You!" to our entire Parish Council, and, in a special way, to Abraham Herr and Andy Vachon who have now completed their three-year term on the Parish Council.
