- WHAT WE CELEBRATE: The Church's official recognition of the Trinity as the three "persons" of the one God Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
- ✤ DATE: Celebrated the First Sunday after Pentecost.
- ESTABLISHED: While the "Votive Mass of the Holy Spirit" was composed in the 4th Century, it did not become a universal celebration until AD 828.
- INTERESTING FACT: The Mass used on Trinity Sunday is a response to the Arian Heresy from the 4th Century, which denied the divinity of Jesus.

THE MOST HOLY TRINITY SUNDAY - MAY 26, 2024

This weekend (May 25th/26th), the Church celebrates the **Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity**. Though we have entered back into **Ordinary Time**, we still have several major celebrations before we return to a "green" Sunday in the second weekend of June. Transitioning from the joy of **Pentecost** and acknowledging the coming of the Holy Spirit, we now see how we ourselves are called into and participate in the divine life of the Most Holy Trinity.

The **Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity** reminds us that, through Jesus Christ, the divine life of the Most Holy Trinity has been revealed and made accessible to us. And, we, in turn, are now invited to share in this life for all eternity: We have been adopted by the **Father**, are brethren and joint-heirs of the **Son**, and have the **Holy Spirit** dwelling within us. Truly, our very lives are meant to be fully immersed in the divine love that is God.

This divine life is nourished in us now for a time through reception of the Most Holy Eucharist. For this reason, our liturgical calendar moves from the **Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity** to the **Solemnity of Corpus Christi** next weekend. In the Eucharist, we receive the Lord in a unique and intimate way. In the words of the 20th Century martyr, St. Maximilian Kolbe, the Eucharist should transform "our hearts into a fire of love and gratitude."

CORPUS CHRISTI PROCESSION

Join us next Sunday immediately following the 10 AM Sunday Mass for our *Corpus Christi* Eucharistic Procession. This procession is scheduled to take us off-campus and into our local community. The full route is only **0.6 miles**, but will still have three stops, or stations, along the way as we bring our Lord into the streets, hear from the Sacred Scriptures, and pray for those in need.

At the end of the procession, you are invited to stay for an informal icecream social and visit with fellow parishioners. We are also planning to have a few cars available to taxi those who walked back to the parish parking lot. As this is the first time in recent memory that our procession will go off campus, I encourage you to consider joining in the procession. Our very presence in the procession will be a powerful witness to our belief in the Holy Eucharist.

ST. FRANCIS SUMMER READING PROGRAM

Starting the second weekend of June, we will begin our annual **St. Francis Summer Reading Program**. This summer program invites our youth and young parishioners to read a variety of faith-based books throughout the summer and the opportunity to receive prizes based on the number of pages and books read.


