

THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST (CORPUS CHRISTI) **SUNDAY - JUNE 2, 2024**

If you are reading this before our 10 AM Mass on Sunday, make sure to join us for our Corpus Christi procession as we honor our Eucharistic Lord through the streets of our community.

This weekend (June 1st/2nd), the Church celebrates the **Solemnity of Corpus** Christi. Since AD 1246, this solemnity always fell on the Thursday after the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This use of Thursday for the celebration was meant to unite our focus with the celebration of the Last Supper on Holy **Thursday.** Throughout the United States, however, this celebration has now been transferred to the nearest Sunday to allow for greater participation.

This celebration honors our timeless belief in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. This truth has stood as the cornerstone of our Faith since it was proclaimed by Our Lord Himself in the Bread of Life Discourse (John 6). Described as the very "source and summit" of our Faith (Catechism, Paragraphs 1324-1327), the reality of the Eucharist is beyond words. In the Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, Christ Himself.

The earliest Christian attest to this truth. In AD 110, St. Ignatius of Antioch, a disciple of St. John the Apostle, hands on this truth that which he himself received from the mouth of the Apostle: Those who were outside of the Church "abstained from the Eucharist and from prayer because they do not confess that the Eucharist is the flesh of our Savior Jesus Christ, flesh which suffered for our sins and which that Father, in his goodness, raised up again."

In AD 151, St. Justin Martyr, explaining the Faith to the Roman Emperor, states: "As we have been taught, the food which has been made into the Eucharist by the Eucharistic prayer set down by him is both the flesh and the blood of the incarnated Jesus." Tertullian of Carthage, often called the Father of Western Theology, explains in AD 210 that our "flesh feeds in the Eucharist on the body and blood of Christ."

In AD 227, St. Augustine of Hippo, teaching the newly baptized, states: "That bread which you see on the altar, having been sanctified by the word of God, is the body of Christ. What is in that chalice, having been sanctified by the word of God, is the blood of Christ." Similarly, to those entering the Church in AD 350, St. Cyril of Jerusalem questions who would "dare to doubt any longer that the Eucharist is Jesus' Body since He Himself has declared it."

Century after century, the teaching is the same: The Eucharist is the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ. It is no mere sign or symbol, but a true reality, His Real Presence, given to us by the very same Lord Himself. Our solemnity today celebrates this reality, one that should fill our hearts with gratitude as we are in the presence of the Lord Himself. For this reason, we go into the streets today as well, so that all may have a chance to encounter Him.

For those participating in the *Corpus Christi* procession, you may notice several unique practices. A canopy will walk in procession over the Blessed Sacrament, both (practically) protecting the Blessed Sacrament from adverse weather and (spiritually) creating a visible sacred space where our Lord is exalted in His Eucharistic glory.

Along the journey, we will have several "stational" stops. Each stop will be accompanied by a Scripture reading and prayer. These "stations" remind us that this procession is meant to mirror our life: Moving from destination to another as we seek to follow after the Lord, who is leading the way.

DAILY MASS

As our schedules shift into summer-mode and become a bit more flexible, it is always good to remember that we do offer daily Masses Tuesdays through Saturdays. Daily Mass on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays are at 8:00 AM, on Wednesdays at 7:00 PM, and Fridays at 8:30 AM. In the words of St. Padre Pio, assisting at Mass "produces in our souls marvelous effects, abundant spiritual and material graces which we, ourselves, do not know."


