

FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - FEBRUARY 9, 2025

This weekend (February 8th/9th), the Church celebrates the **Fifth Sunday** in **Ordinary Time**. Our readings for this Sunday combine two major themes: *awe* and *apostolate*. In our first reading and our Gospel, both Isaiah and Peter are *awed* and ashamed to find themselves in the presence of God. Yet, despite this, both are still "*sent out*" (*apostello* in Greek) on a mission for God in service to the world, which is called an *apostolate*.

Like Isaiah and Peter, there might be times when we, too, feel our own unworthiness and need of mercy in God's presence. Yet, like them, God is still willing to send us out as well, just as we are sent out at the end of every Mass ("Go and proclaim the Gospel of the Lord!"). The Lord often trusts us even more than we trust ourselves. For this reason, each of us shares in a common apostolate through our baptism to spread the good news of mercy to all people.

LIVING WITH THE SAINTS - LEARNING ABOUT THEIR LIVES

As announced at the start of this liturgical year, our theme for the liturgical year is "Living with the Saints." One of the ways we embraced this theme was with our annual "choosing" of a Saint to walk with into the New Year on the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. Another way that we will continue to embrace this theme throughout the year is to highlight the lives of various Saints on our bulletin cover whenever the weekend allows.

Ordinary Time is often a wonderful season to look into the lives of the Saints. These many weeks are often interwoven with the memorials and feasts of so many holy men and women that we can learn so much from. Our bulletin cover this weekend highlights St. Scholastica, whose feast day is this coming Monday, Feb. 10th. The short story of her life comes from our weekly offering of "*The Kid's Bulletin*," available in the narthex for our younger parishioners.

The story reflected on the bulletin cover is one of the more famous accounts of St. Scholastica's life. Following after her twin brother, St. Benedict, St. Scholastica founded a convent near Monte Cassino in Italy. The two would meet once a year to visit and, on their last visit before St. Scholastica's death, she prayed for more time with him. In answer to her prayers, a sudden storm miraculously arose, preventing his departure so they could visit a bit longer.

Today, St. Scholastica is recognized as the patron saint of Benedictine nuns, education, and is often invoked for protection from storms and rain.

PARISH GAME NIGHT

Join us for a Parish Game Night next Saturday, February 15th, in the Parish Social Hall following the 5:00 PM vigil Mass. Learning from the example of Sts. Scholastica and Benedict, sometimes the most precious moments are the moments when we have the chance to simply visit with one another. Such social gatherings, such as Parish Game Night, allows us to gather as a parish family and spend that precious time visiting with one another.

WINTER WEATHER REMINDER

With the recent inclement weather and the unpredictability of Indiana weather patterns, please remember that our weekend Masses will always be offered as scheduled at St. Joseph's (Saturday Vigil Mass – 5 PM; Sunday Masses – 7:30 AM and 10 AM). As disciples of the Lord, we have a positive obligation to keep holy the Lord's Day and, when we are physically able to, to gather together to worship at the Sacrifice of the Mass.

The above being said, an obligation does assume that that which is asked of us is physically possible. If the weather is bad, roads are impassable, and you do not feel safe traveling in the icy weather, please stay safe and stay home.

Please Note: Next weekend (Feb. 15th/16th), we welcome **Fr. Bill Sullivan** as the main celebrant for all of our Masses. At this time of year, I often travel with several of my seminary classmates for retreat. Sadly, our schedules did not allow for gathering this year. I will still, however, be taking this scheduled time away for some prayer and rest in preparation for the beginning of Lent.


