The priest is the ordinary minister of Baptism; In the case of an emergency (such as in the danger of death), anyone may baptize.

## How is Baptism administered?

Water is poured on the head three times as the following is said: I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

# How often can Baptism be received?

Baptism can be received only once at it imprints a spiritual mark, called an indelible character, on the soul that can never be lost or removed.

## Who instituted the Sacrament of Baptism?

Jesus sends forth His disciples with the command to "make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit" (Matthew 28:19-20).

**Happy Father's Day** to all those in our parish who are fathers, grandfathers, godfathers, uncles, and all who provide a father's care to others in so many ways. By living out your vocation of fatherhood, you help to help reveal to us glimpses of the very fatherhood of God. Thank you for living out your vocation. Know of our love and gratitude for you. May St. Joseph, foster-father of Jesus, intercede for you before the throne of God.

This weekend (June 17<sup>th</sup>/18<sup>th</sup>), the Church celebrates the **Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time**. Following **Pentecost** and the **Solemnities of the Holy Trinity and the Holy Eucharist**, we return at last to a "green" Sunday after over sixteen weeks. Save for a few other solemnities and feast days, we will now spend the remainder of the liturgical year (twenty-four weeks) in **Ordinary Time**.

Though called "ordinary," this time is anything but. The term "ordinary" itself comes from the Latin *ordinalis*, meaning "numbered" or "ordered," and simply reflects that these weekends are numbered. It does not mean that this period of time is devoid of its own special mysteries. Instead, that which we experienced throughout the first half of the liturgical year will now be unpacked over the many coming weeks.

This unpacking is done through our readings from the Sacred Scriptures. The focus of these readings through **Ordinary Time** is on the moral life and the teachings of the Lord. As we spent the first half of the liturgical year walking alongside the life of Christ, we now focus on how to walk the life of Christ in our own lives. We are called to put into action all that has been revealed to us up to this point.

### NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL - THE PARISH YEAR

Thank you to all those who joined in our Eucharistic Procession for *Corpus Christi* **Sunday** last weekend. We joined with parishes throughout the diocese hosting processions to inaugurate the **Parish Year of the National Eucharistic Revival**. Among events this coming year, we will host a **Forty Hours Devotion** in November and a procession that extends beyond our parish campus and into our parish community next *Corpus Christi* Sunday (May 29, 2024).

#### **DID YOU KNOW? THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM**

Baptism is our entry into the Body of Christ, which is the Church. Through this Sacrament, we are cleansed of Original Sin (*and any personal sin up to that very moment*) and receive sanctifying grace. Sanctifying grace is that free gift which restores that which was lost in the fall of our first parents, our relationship with God. Through baptism, we are born into supernatural life (John 3:1-21) and become Children of God and, as such, heirs of heaven.

Baptism is administered through the three-fold pouring of water on the head of the person to be baptized as the Trinitarian formula is recited ("*I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit*"). **The outward sign** of the pouring of (or immersion into) water is a sign of washing or cleansing and signifies the washing away of Original Sin that occurs through the action.

The person to be baptized is an individual of any age. If they are beyond the age of reason, the person will present themselves to be baptized once they have been prepared in the Faith. If below the age of reason, those to whom their care is entrusted (parents/guardians) will bring them forth. In the latter situation, those presenting a child for baptism make a promise and commitment on behalf of the child to raise them in the Faith so that they might live that supernatural life into which they have now been born.

Jesus not only institutes this Sacrament as He commands His Disciples (Matthew 28:19-20) to baptize and gives them the form to be used, but He also declares explicitly the necessity of baptism (John 3). In this necessary Sacrament, we are given sanctifying grace, become members of the Church, and are able to receive the other Sacraments. In addition to the Sacrament of Baptism itself, the Church also recognizes baptism by blood (martyrdom) and desire for those who could not, through no fault of their own, approach the Sacrament of Baptism.
