PIPHANY HOUSE

"Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw His star at its rising and have come to do Him homage." Matthew 2:2

After Jesus' birth in Bethlehem, the Holy Family was visited by three Magi from the east. They came to worship Christ and bring Him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. "Chalking the door" is a centuries-old custom where Christians, on the **Feast of Epiphany**, ask God's blessing over their homes. This practice remembers the hospitality of the Holy Family to the Magi and entrusts all in our homes to God's protection and blessing.

"In the magi, representatives of the neighboring pagan religions, the Gospel sees the first-fruits of the nations, who welcome the good news of salvation through the Incarnation. The magi's coming to Jerusalem in order to pay homage to the king of the Jews shows that they seek in Israel, in the messianic

> light of the star of David, the one who will be king of the nations."

THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD - JANUARY 5, 2025

This weekend (January $4^{th}/5^{th}$), the Church celebrates the **Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord**. This celebration is meant to mark the twelfth day of **Christmastide** and celebrates the Magi seeking out "*the newborn King of the Jews*" (Matthew 2:2). With the arrival of the Shepherds (Luke 16:16-21) and, now, the Magi, Jew and Gentile alike have sought out and encountered the Messiah (cf. Ephesians 2:14-22).

With the arrival of the Shepherds, the Christ-child's humanity as the Word made Flesh was recognized. In the Epiphany, Jesus' Divinity is proclaimed. For this reason, the Epiphany is traditionally associated with three different scriptural events: (1) The Arrival of the Magi; (2) The Baptism of the Lord; and (3) The Wedding Feast of Cana. In each of these moments, Jesus' Divinity is, in some way, revealed (*or manifested*) to the world.

As has become our parish tradition, we will bless and pass out Epiphany Chalk after all Masses this weekend. Included with the Epiphany Chalk are holy water and instructions in how we can use the chalk and holy water to bless our homes in this new year. This sacramental act itself serves as another form of "*manifestation*" of Jesus to the world as we publicly invite the Lord to dwell within our homes and sanctify our daily lives.

WHAT'S IN A NAME - IHS / JHS

This past Friday, the Church celebrated the **Feast of the Holy Name of Jesus**. This celebration references the scriptural account of Jesus receiving His name eight days after His birth (Luke 2:21). It also finds roots within the writings of St. Paul, who proclaims that God the Father gave Jesus "*that name which is above every name*" (Philippians 2:9). This name is, of course, Jesus or, in Hebrew, Yeshua, which means "*God saves*."

Devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus is often reflected through the use of the Christogram, or the letters "*IHS*." Found in use as early as the third century, "*IHS*" serves as an abbreviation of the Greek spelling of the Lord's name (I $\eta\sigma\sigma\tilde{v}\varsigma$). This is why you will occasionally see these three letters (or "*JHS*" as a Latin variation) on vestments, altar cloths, or liturgical artwork. They serve as a reminder of the power of Jesus' name.

TEACHING MASS—THURSDAY, JAN. 16TH AT 6:30 PM

Join us on **Thursday, Jan. 16th at 6:30 PM in the Church** for a "Teaching Mass." Though not an actual Mass, this event is a walk-through of the liturgy itself that highlights and explores the rich meaning behind the various elements, both prayers and items, of the Mass. This special event offers us an opportunity to deepen our understanding and appreciation of the Mass. All are welcome—come with questions and an open heart!

If you know of anyone outside of our parish who may be interested in learning about the Catholic Mass, please invite them to join us as well. In the words of Scott Hahn: "*The liturgy is where heaven and earth meet, and we encounter the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world.*" There is no more beautiful experience to introduce someone to the Faith then Mass itself!

GREAT CATHOLIC THINKERS—THE HOUND OF HEAVEN

Starting on **Monday, January 13th, at 6:30 PM in the Parish Conference Room**, we will be offering "*Great Catholic Thinkers*" every other Monday over the next several months.
