THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - OCTOBER 27, 2024

This weekend (October 26th/27th), the Church celebrates the **Thirtieth** Sunday in Ordinary Time. As we near the end of the liturgical year (*ending after the Thirty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time*), our focus begins to turn towards heavenly things. Though our readings seem, on the surface, to be about physical sight, on a deeper level, they instead remind us to see things through the eyes of God and focus on our true end: **Heaven**.

THEOLOGY ON TAP: ANGELS AND DEMONS

Join us this Tuesday, October 29th at 6:30 PM for our next Theology on Tap at Parlor City Brewery (212 W Market St., Bluffton). This event is open to all (21+) as we delve into the roles these spiritual beings play in our faith and lives: their influences, purposes, and the profound truths they reveal about God's creation. Food and drink will be available for purchase at the Brewery.

SOLEMNITY OF ALL SAINTS - HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION

This **Friday, November 1**st, the Church celebrates the **Solemnity of All Saints, a Holy Day of Obligation**. This celebration is rooted in the *Feast of All Martyrs* celebrated among many eastern Churches at the beginning of the 4th Century. Gaining popularity in the West at the beginning of the 7th Century, it was added to the universal liturgical calendar in the 9th Century.

To aide in our obligation to assist at Mass for this holy day, we are offering four different Mass times:

All Saints' Day Vigil Mass - Thursday, Oct. 31st at 7:00 p.m. All Saints' Day Mass - Friday, Nov. 1st at 7:00 a.m., 12:00 p.m., 5:30 p.m.

Following the 5:30 p.m. Mass, you are invited to join us for our annual **All Saints' Day Party** in the Parish Social Hall. Come dressed as your favorite Saint for a time of parish fellowship and fraternity.

COMMEMORATION OF ALL SOULS - BLESSING OF AN ALTAR

On Saturday, November 2nd, we will have a special 5:00 PM Mass for the Commemoration of All Souls at St. Joseph Catholic Cemetery. At this Mass, we will bless and, for the first time, offer Mass on the recently installed cemetery altar. The blessing of an altar is itself a fairly rare occasion, often occurring only with the dedication of a new church building or chapel.

Utilizing the imagery of St. John from the Book of Revelation, our cemetery altar serves as a reminder of our hope in the resurrection. Just as our Saviour appears as the Lamb who has been sacrificed and whose offering is taken by the angels to the altar in heaven (Revelation 5:6), so we pray and hope that our loved ones will likewise be raised from their tombs to that same altar in heaven, joining the Saints and angels in the praise of God for all eternity.

I invite our whole parish family to join us next Saturday evening at the cemetery for this outdoor Mass and historic event in the life of our parish. (*Note: This evening Mass <u>does</u> count for our Sunday obligation.*) For those who cannot join us Saturday evening at the cemetery, Fr. Bill Sullivan will be offering our regular Saturday vigil Mass at the Church.

LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST - HOLY, HOLY, HOLY

After the Preface, we join the angelic choirs in praying the Holy, Holy, Holy. This unending hymn of angelic praise reflects both Isaiah's vision of God in the vision of a king in a majestic throne (Isaiah 6:1-4) and St. John's vision of the six-winged angelic creatures before the throne of God singing such praise (Revelations 4:8).


Other words in the **Holy**, **Holy**, **Holy** like 'Hosanna' and 'Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord' are also expressions of biblical origin. These words can be found in Psalm 118 and were the phrases with which the crowds greeted Jesus as He processed into the city of Jerusalem on **Palm Sunday**.





MNOW?

WE HAVE FRIENDS IN HEAVEN

Looking at the lives of those who have faithfully followed Jesus Christ, we see a great cloud of witnesses (Heb. 12:1). These men and women, known as Saints, are our brothers and sisters in Christ who, having gone before us, are before God's throne in Heaven (Rev. 5:8). They support us with their prayers and friendship so that we too might one day join in the same heavenly chorus, praising God together for all eternity.

Our relationship with the Saints requires a true understanding of the difference between worship and prayer. Worship is adoration and is given to God alone. Prayer is a form of conversation in which we speak to God and to all those in union with

Him. We adore God alone. We have a devotion towards and pray to God's Saints who are now united with Him in Heaven.

Though the Saints have passed into eternity, they are not dead. As our Lord Himself reminds us, our God "is not God of the dead, but of the living, for to Him all are alive" (Luke 20:38). As members of the one Body of Christ (1 Cor. 12:27), we remain, even now, united to those who have gone before us. As St. Paul reminds us, nothing, not even death itself, can separate us in Christ (Rom. 8:38-39).

We can turn to Jesus through the Saints. Just as we ask our loved ones on earth to pray for us (cf. 2 Thes. 3:1; Rom. 15:30), so we also ask our heavenly brothers and sisters to pray for us as well. As St. James reminds us: "The fervent prayer of a righteous person is very powerful" (James 5:16).

PURGATORY AND PRAYING FOR THE DEAD

Purgatory is that name which the Catholic Church gives to our final purification, which occurs at the end of our life. Because we still sin in this life, but we will not sin when we are in glory, there is a final period of purification between our death and glorification in Jesus. Purgatory is this final act of sanctification, earned for us through Jesus Christ's sacrifice upon the Cross, and serves as our transition into glory.

If we die in the love of God but possess any "stains of sin," such stains are cleansed away in this final purifying process. Purgatory itself is not a place but a stage or process in the afterlife. In this stage, the dead are aided by the prayers of the living. This is exemplified in the Scriptural account of Judas Maccabeus, who had sacrifices offered in Jerusalem to make "atonement for the dead that they might be absolved from their sins" (2 Maccabees 12:39-45). This same practice of prayer has also been attested to throughout history. St. Augustine of Hippo states that "the whole Church observes this practice, which was handed down by the Fathers" (Sermons 172.2, 411 AD).

Having passed through purgatory, we will be utterly unselfish and fully capable of perfect love. Our selfish ego, which restlessly sought our own self-satisfaction, will finally have died forever. Our "new self" will be our same inner self, but will be purified and transformed by the intensity of God's love. In this way, we obtain "that holiness without which no one will see the Lord" (Hebrews 12:14).


