TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - SEPTEMBER 22, 2024

This weekend (September 21^{st/}22nd), the Church celebrates the **Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time**. Our readings help us to explore the theme of the suffering of the righteous. We are called to discard our usual standards for judging success in this world and adopt a radically supernatural outlook on life. When we look through the eyes of Christ, we often see that which the world considers as valuable is truly nothing more than mere straw.

In our commitment to follow after the Lord, we may never achieve any true position of authority or recognition in this world. But, what we gain in return is much more valuable than anything else: **God Himself**. We are invited today to make ourselves like the "children" of the earth—the unnoticed, the weak, the innocent, the marginalized—because it is in them that God reveals Himself present in a unique way.

We welcome Deacon Bruce Goodwin at all of our Masses this weekend. Dcn. Bruce is a son of our parish, having grown up in Bluffton, and was ordained as a permanent deacon several years ago for the Archdiocese of Atlanta, where he now lives. He and his wife, Jean, are in town to visit with family and enjoy our Street Fair festivities.

When a deacon assists at Mass, he is often vested in a dalmatic, which, similar to the priest's chasuble, is a long tunic-like vestment. Configured through Holy Orders to Christ the Servant, the deacon stands next to and assists the priest throughout the liturgy. This ministry is focused in a special way on proclaiming the Gospel and serving at the altar.

As a part of proclaiming the Gospel, the deacon carries in the Book of the Gospels, proclaims the Gospel reading, and, at times, is invited to preach the homily. In addition, he also proclaims the Prayers of the Faithful, inviting us to turn toward the Lord in our need.

In service at the altar, the deacon prepares the altar during the Offertory and assists in the distribution of Holy Communion, particularly the distribution of the Precious Blood when it is offered. Finally, after the priest has imparted the closing blessing, the deacon offers the dismissal as we are sent out like Christ the Servant to minister to and be with those in need.

INTRODUCTORY RITES - THE GLORIA

Having acknowledged our sinfulness before the Lord, we join in a prayerful cry that echoes throughout the Scriptures: *Lord, have mercy!* This ancient litany is the whole Body of Christ calling out to Christ the Head. It is each of us, together with the entire Church, imploring the mercy of Almighty God so that we may be made ready and worthy to enter into the mystery of the Sacrifice of Christ made present on the altar.

Our sinfulness reminds us of how much we need to be saved. We, in turn, are called to focus our gaze on Christ, who is the channel of God 's infinite love and mercy. From here, recognizing our Savior Himself, our lips move from cries of "Lord, have mercy!" to a hymn of praise: **The Gloria**. This hymn, affectionately known as the song of the angels, joins our voices with those of the heavenly choir of angels crying out in joy at Jesus' birth.

The Gloria is the perfect response of the solemn confession of one's sins and pleading for salvation to the uplifting and joyous gratitude for the gift of salvation Himself, Jesus Christ. The hymn itself incorporates verses from Scripture – words spoken by angels, spirits, the apostles, and ancient patriarchs like Melchizedek. We echo these words, perfected through the worship of those that have gone before us.

The words of **the Gloria** reflect the various dispositions we take on as we participate in Mass: (1) **Praise of God** – "We worship you… we praise you…". (2) **Thanksgiving** – "We give you thanks… for your glory." (3) **Atonement of sins** – "You take away the sins of the world: have mercy on us."; (4) **Petition** – "Receive our prayer." In **the Gloria**, let us focus on these aspects of the prayer as we join with choirs of angels in singing "Glory to God in the highest."






