

#### TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - AUGUST 25, 2024

This weekend (August 24<sup>th</sup>/25<sup>th</sup>), the Church celebrates the **Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time**. After five full weeks, we are concluding our walk -through of the sixth chapter of the *Gospel of St. John*. Having heard from both the *Feeding of the Five Thousand* and the *Bread of Life Discourse*, we have received our Lord's teaching on the Holy Eucharist. Starting next weekend, we will resume our walk-through of the *Gospel of St. Mark* for the remainder of the liturgical year.

Though we are concluding our walk-through of the sixth chapter of the *Gospel of St. John*, we actually end two verses shy of completing the chapter. Our Gospel reading today ends on a high note with John 6:69 and the words of St. Peter. Asked if they too shall abandon Him like the others, St. Peter answers for the Twelve that they will not and cannot abandon Him, for they "have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God."

The remaining two verses of the chapter, however, take a different turn from the beautiful words of St. Peter. After this proclamation of fidelity, the Lord then references, for the first time in the *Gospel of St. John*, the coming betrayal of Judas. This betrayal culminates, of course, in John 13 when Judas leaves the Last Supper to go forth and betray the Lord. The very same Lord who gives us His body freely as food is sold by Judas for thirty pieces of silver.

These elements of Judas' betrayal, first announced at the *Bread of Life Discourse* and brought to completion at the Last Supper, shows us how closely fidelity and intimacy with the Lord are intrinsically tied to the Holy Eucharist. Truly, our reception of the Holy Eucharist is meant to unite us ever more closely to the Lord. May we see in the Holy Eucharist the greatest of gifts that truly binds us ever more closely with the Lord Himself.


## G.I.R.L.'s Night Out
