TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - SEPTEMBER 15, 2024

This weekend (Sept. 14th/15th), the Church celebrates the **Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time**. Over the past three weekends (*and continuing for two more*), our second reading has been taken from the Letter of St. James. Tradition holds that "St. James" is the Apostle known as St. James the Lesser, son of Alpheus (Matthew 10:3). As seen in the Acts of the Apostles, St. James served as the Bishop of Jerusalem before facing martyrdom in AD 62.

As we hear from the Letter of St. James, we may begin to see how it shows itself to be intensely practical. Offering short statements regarding the "basics" of living out a life in Christ, this letter serves almost as a New Testament form of "wisdom literature," similar to that Proverbs or Sirach. Though unique among New Testament letters, the Letter of St. James is one worth revisiting quite frequently, especially in our own prayerful reading of the Scriptures.

Introductory Rites—The Confiteor

Having received the unique greeting at the beginning of Mass, "The Lord be with you," we respond "And with your spirit." This equally unique response acknowledges the presence and working of the Holy Spirit through the priest in virtue of his ordination. This response affirms that the priest is acting in the person of Jesus (in persona Christi capitas) and performs the sacred duties of the liturgy through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Having greeted one another, we now prepare to approach the Lord exactly as St. Justin Martyr recorded in the 2nd Century: "Assemble on the Lord's day, and break bread and offer the Eucharist; but first make confession of your faults, so that your sacrifice may be a pure one." Before approaching the altar of the Lord, we first acknowledge our own sinfulness and ask for God's help in the Penitential Rite.

Participating in this rite with a true interior repentance can bring about one's own conversion. Described by St. Thomas Aquinas in the 13th Century, the Penitential Rite is "an act proceeding from grace, in detestation of venial sin... as when one is moved fervently to God." Though different from the Sacrament of Confession, this rite, when prayed fervently, can still move our hearts to conversion and bring about a desire to seek reconciliation with others.

The Penitential Rite itself has a communal nature to it. Though we do not name our sins in it, we are, nevertheless, admitting our guilt not only to God but to all those present. This highlights the social effects of sin, where sin affects not just our relationship with God but our relationships with each other.
