This past week, I spent Tuesday-Thursday attending a series of conferences with the priests of our diocese. This series, part of our annual continuing education, focused on praying and preaching with the Sacred Scriptures. We heard from five speakers, professors from the Theology Department at Notre Dame, who offered great insight into the various elements of the Scriptures.

One of the main takeaways I received from the conferences is this beautiful reminder: *All Scripture is meant for us!* The Sacred Scriptures are the living and active word of God that speaks to us here and now. Read in the light of Sacred Tradition and through the guidance of the Magisterium, we prayerfully experience and are called to share that abundant wealth that is the divine word.

UPDATE ON PARISH RENOVATIONS—PART I

I am very excited to announce some forward movement regarding parish renovations. To date, we have received approval from both Bishop Rhoades and the Liturgy Committee of our diocesan Office of Worship to enter the planning phase for renovations. Since then, I've had the opportunity, along with members of our Parish Staff and Finance Committee, to meet with Bill Heyer of William Heyer Architecture out of Bexley, Ohio.

Bill and his firm come highly recommended from parishes throughout our diocese. In just the past few years, his firm built *St. Francis Oratory* at the University of St. Francis and *St. Mary Magdalene Oratory* at St. Vincent de Paul in Fort Wayne, renovated the church, chapel, and narthex at *St. Charles* in Fort Wayne, is currently renovating the adoration chapel at *St. Jude* in Fort Wayne, and planning renovations at *St. Rose of Lima* in Monroeville.

During our meeting, we had the opportunity to walk through our Church and discuss a number of possibilities to both upkeep and build upon its beauty. Most needed, as many have noticed, is updated flooring to replace our heavily worn carpet, fresh paint in the sanctuary and nave due to wear and damage, and an increased seating capacity to accommodate our growing parish family.

With these needs in mind, I've asked Bill to put together an initial design so that we, as a parish family, can better conceptualize some of the possibilities available to us. This will be our first major renovation as a parish in nearly 25+ years with the addition of the EJ Schaefer Parish Center in 2000. I look forward to see what God will bring about for our parish at this time!

LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST - THE PREFACE

Once the altar is prepared and the Offertory comes a close, the Preface marks the start of the Eucharistic Prayer in the Liturgy of the Eucharist. This prayerful transition is meant to excite the Faithful to devotion for what is about to happen at the altar: The Sacrifice of Jesus Christ offered to the Father.

First, a dialogue takes place between the priest and the Faithful. The words spoken from both priest and Faithful are immersed in biblical significance. Then, the dialogue changes with the Preface prayer. The priest now speaks on behalf of the Faithful as the head of the Body of Christ gathered together. This prayer is one of gratitude between Son and Father for the sacrifice of salvation.


