

This weekend (October 5th/6th), the Church celebrates the Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time. This month marks the Month of the Holy Rosary. We are encouraged to pray the Rosary daily to promote peace in the world.

PRAYER SERVICE - DAY FOR PREGNANCY AND INFANT LOSS REMEMBRANCE

Since 1998, the Sunday closest to October 15th has been nationally observed as the annual Day for Pregnancy and Infant Loss Remembrance. In observance of this day, we will hold a prayer service to remember and support those affected by pregnancy and infant loss. This Memorial Prayer Service will be on Sunday, October 13th, at St. Joseph Catholic Cemetery at 2 PM. This service is open to parishioners and all throughout Wells County.

The prayer service includes the opportunity to place memorial "butterfly" ornaments at the cemetery. These memorial "butterfly" ornaments will be available in the narthex, at both of our local funeral homes throughout this coming week, and at the cemetery the day of the prayer service. Those who may not be ready to attend a public service are invited to take and place their own "butterfly" ornaments at the cemetery privately.

Ask Father - Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship

With our national and local election cycles in full swing, we will be offering a special "Ask Father" on Tuesday, October 22nd, at 6:30 PM in the Parish Conference Room. During this session, we will review our national Bishops' Conference teaching document on the political responsibility of Catholics: Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship. This document is available for review on our parish website.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

The Liturgy of the Word consists of three readings and a psalm. The First Reading comes from the Old Testament, except during Eastertide when we hear from the Acts of the Apostles. The Responsorial Psalm is taken from the Psalms or one of the scriptural canticles. The Second Reading from the letters of the New Testament, except during Eastertide when we hear from the Book of Revelation. Finally, the Gospel always comes from one of the four Gospels.

The First Reading is usually chosen based on its connection with the Gospel. This arrangement highlights the unity of the Old and New Testaments and the history of salvation, with Christ always at its center. The Responsorial **Psalm** is chosen in close relation to the **First Reading** and is meant to foster a deeper meditation on Sacred Scripture. The psalm draws out our reflection on God's salvific nature and deeds.

The **Second Reading**, unlike the first, is generally not intentionally aligned with the **Gospel** (or any other reading). Instead, it offers examples of practical applications of how a life in Christ can be lived. Though written centuries ago, these readings are still fundamentally relevant for us today. The Gospel serves as our primary encounter in the Liturgy of the Word with the life of Jesus, who is the "Word made flesh." As such, the Gospel is a saving message that is meant to be life-changing.

Though seated throughout most of the Liturgy of the Word, at the **Gospel** we stand in reverence and sing "Alleluia", a Hebrew expression of joy that means "Praise the Lord!" The priest carries the Book of the Gospels, slightly elevated, from the altar to the lectern, accompanied by altar servers carrying candles. This procession underscores the solemnity of the Gospel.

In preparation to hear the Gospel, we make a significant three-fold sign of the cross on our forehead, our lips, and over our heart. Accordingly, we prayerfully ask for the **Gospel** to penetrate the whole of our being, influencing us totally, and taking firm root in our mind and heart, such that we may always profess these saving words with our mouth. ~Faithfully in Christ, Fr. 

ANNUAL BULLETIN ANNOUNCEMENT FROM OUR DIOCESE

It remains important for our Church to protect children and young persons from the evils of abuse. The Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend remains committed to upholding and following its guidelines, policies and procedures that were implemented for the protection of children and young people. These can be reviewed on the diocese's website, www.diocesefwsb.org, under "Youth Protection."

If you have reason to believe that a minor may be a victim of child abuse or neglect, Indiana law requires that you report this to civil authorities. If you or someone you know was abused as a child or young person by an adult, you are encouraged to notify appropriate civil authorities of that abuse. In addition, if the alleged abuser is or was a member of the clergy or anyone ministering on behalf of the Catholic Church, you are encouraged to contact Jodi Marlin, Victim Assistance Coordinator, at (260) 399-1458 or Rev. Mark Gurtner, Vicar General of the Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend, at P.O. Box 390, Fort Wayne, Indiana, 46801; at (260) 399-1419; or at mgurtner@diocesefwsb.org. The diocese is committed to helping prevent the abuse or neglect of children and young people and to assist those who have suffered harm as a result of such abuse.
