### PARISH FINANCIAL AND SPIRITUAL REPORT

Every two years, our diocesan Business Office audits all parishes in our diocese. During our latest parish audit, it was recommended that we begin publishing an annual financial report at the end of the fiscal year. In our diocese, the fiscal year begins on July 1<sup>st</sup> and ends on June 30<sup>th</sup>. After this year closed out, our business manager, Michelle, our Finance Council, and myself have prepared our parish's first annual financial report for release.

While being prudent stewards of our parish finances is of great importance, it is not the only factor for us to consider when looking at the health of our parish. For this reason, our financial report is joined by a spiritual report, reviewing the sacramental life of our parish family over this past year. Both reports were approved by our Parish Council and are included in this bulletin (and available on the parish website) for your review.

#### BOOK STUDY—THE DIVINE COMEDY BY DANTE ALIGHIERI

In the 4th Century, St. Augustine of Hippo said: "He who wishes often to be with God ought to pray frequently and read pious books." In the past, I've often offered Bible studies in the Fall. This year, I would like to invite you to join me in a journey through *The Divine Comedy* of Dante Alighieri. This momentous poetic work is arguably one of the greatest poems ever written as it undertakes a deep spiritual reflection on morality.

Starting on Monday, Sept. 23rd, at 6:30 PM in the Parish Conference Room, we will meet every other Monday as we journey through *The Divine Comedy*. This work is itself broken into three sections: *The Inferno, Purgatory, and Paradise*. We begin our journey delving into the *Inferno* and progressing level by infernal level to its diabolical depths. The journey itself is meant to move man from misery in the *Inferno* towards the happiness of *Paradise*.

There is <u>no cost</u> for this book study. While you are welcome to purchase or use your own copy of *The Divine Comedy*, I will also be making available free PDF copies of our material for each session. If you would like to join me in this poetic journey, please see the sign-up sheet in the Narthex.

#### INTRODUCTORY RITES—"THE LORD BE WITH YOU"

The **Introductory Rites** of the Mass begins first in the Entrance Procession. Symbolically, the procession moves us from the narthex, representing the world, toward the Sanctuary, representing heaven. This is a reminder that, in the words of St. Augustine, "we are journeying toward you, O Lord. Here below we have no lasting dwelling place, but seek one which is to come since our home is in heaven."

The procession enters into the Sanctuary and ends at the altar, which the priest greets with a kiss. The altar itself serves as a symbol of Jesus and the kiss is meant both as reverence towards the sacrifice of Christ which happens upon it and as a symbol of the union of the Spouse (*Christ*) and His Bride (*the Church*) at the Wedding Feast of the Lamb. Finally, as the priest reaches the presider's chair, we join together in making the Sign of the Cross.

The Sign of the Cross remains one of the most ancient of Christian prayers. In word and action, we proclaim both the Triune God and Jesus's sacrificial love for us on Calvary. In this prayer, we are meant to recognize that "our help is in the name of the Lord, who makes Heaven and Earth" (Psalm 124:8). And this help upon whom we call is immediately reflected in our greeting together: **The Lord be with You.** (R. And with your spirit.)

This is no ordinary greeting; It is instead a personal call from God towards an awesome mission. Many in the Bible were greeted and called to their own daunting missions with these same words of our Lord: The Blessed Virgin, King David, Moses, and Jeremiah. These simple people were asked to perform great works that may have sounded impossible to them. Yet, God spoke to them as He speaks to us now: With the strongest of assurance, that "I, the Lord will be with you." The Lord is with us; We never walk this journey alone!
